What have been your most significant accomplishments?

Use this opportunity to highlight problems you've solved directly related to this role. You want to illustrate significant achievements related to the role, so the interviewer understands the value you bring to FluentStream.

Why do you want to leave your current position?

Use this question to thank your current role for the things you've learned but explain why you're interested in this current role. Explain what you enjoy most about FluentStream and the position you're interviewing for.

Questions you might be asked during an interview with us

What sets you apart from other candidates?

Highlight your top 3 strengths directly related to this role. Look at the description to determine what strengths we are looking for, and give examples of you possessing these traits in prior roles.

What do you consider your greatest weakness?

Provide an example of how you've worked to improve upon your weaknesses or learn a new skill to combat the issue.

What is your greatest strength?

Again, look at the job description and only talk about strengths directly related to the role you're trying to attain.

Tell me about a time when you made a mistake

Use this opportunity to showcase how you overcome obstacles. Explain a time you made a mistake and highlight the things you did to fix the situation, and lessons you've learned so that it doesn't happen again.

Tell me about some of the most difficult problems you worked on and how you solved them

Show off your problem solving skills and your thought process. You want the interviewer to feel confident in your ability to solve problems and create solutions in this role.

Tell me about a time you worked in an ambiguous environment in which you weren't given a lot of direction and had to take on significant responsibility to get the job done?

Use this question to explain how you've been proactive rather than reactive in solving a problem. Demonstrate your ability to thrive in a startup environment where there is not always clear direction.

Interviewing tips

Questions to ask

- + Have at least 5-8 strong questions prepared.
- + Think of your interview as a conversation.
- + The interviewer should feel as though you are vetting the opportunity just as stringent as they're vetting you for fit.
- + Brainstorm all the questions that could help you determine if this is the right fit for you and ask them.
- + Questions that display your curiosity and research will be noted. Example: I noticed that you announced a strategic partnership with SkyComm Connect, how do these partnerships tie into the business model?
